This intermediate workshop is designed to provide the most current skills to enhance ethical multicultural supervision practice, including cultural humility; competencies; new supervision guidelines and emerging best practices; the supervisory relationship; strain, ruptures, and repair; reflective practice; diversity and multiculturalism in all aspects; assessment, feedback, and evaluation strategies; legal and ethical frames; self-care; and management of supervisees not meeting performance competency standards. Through a competency-based frame, interactive metatheoretical strategies for practice are developed via practice exercises, skill building, video review, and reflection.

This workshop is designed to help you:

1. Identify three components of the definition of competency-based clinical supervision applicable to the local training context and multicultural supervision.
2. Demonstrate how to assess supervisee foundational and functional competencies (knowledge, skills, values/attitudes) that are appropriate for the supervisee's current level of functioning: practicum, internship, or readiness for independent practice.
3. Demonstrate the learning cycle, including self-assessment and reflection processes.
4. Identify two components important to the formation of a supervisory alliance.
5. Develop and implement one formative assessment protocol that will serve as the ethical foundation for the supervision contract, feedback, and evaluation.
6. Demonstrate infusion of diversity-competent knowledge, skills, and values in all aspects of supervision, with cultural humility conveyed through respect of the multiple identities of all members of the supervisory triad (client[s], supervisee, supervisor).
7. Identify one guideline from the Guidelines for Clinical Supervision in Health Service Psychology for application in the local setting.
